Fused Glass





The Lumber City

At 83 Webster Street, the presses were trying to keep up with the news of the day. The Herald newspaper was the original resident of the building. In 1900 "The Herald building and the Herald (newspaper 1875-1903) passed into the possession of The News." There was a good deal to write about during the height of the Erie Canal. North Tonawanda, also known as "The Lumber City" was booming and as it developed into a major lumber port of the Great Lakes. By 1890, the North Tonawanda port became the world's largest lumber distribution center. Timber was transported via the Great Lakes and the Niagara River from Minnesota, Wisconsin, Michigan, and Canada then transferred in Tonawanda. Referred to lumber hookers, lumber rafts, or canal boats and barges transported the lumber east by way of the Erie Canal. The timber industry supplied regional and national building materials, industry, and fuel.
